

# What is Fratton Big Local?

Fratton Big Local is a Big Lottery funded 10-year project. It was launched in 2013 and aims to make lasting improvements to Fratton. It is run by a Partnership of local residents, who make decisions about how to spend the funding. This booklet tells you about the eighth year of Fratton Big Local's work in Fratton, and how plans have developed since you were last consulted.

# What is in the Fratton Big Local Plan?

Our Local plan is set in the context of National Big Local Outcomes: Communities will be better able to identify local needs and take action in response to them. People will have increased skills and confidence, so that they continue to identify and respond to needs in the future. The community make a difference to the needs it prioritizes. People will feel that their area is an even better place to live in.

# How many other Big Locals are there?

There are 150 other Big Locals across England – the nearest to Fratton is on Wecock Farm in Waterlooville.

The Big Lottery funding for all the Big Locals is managed by a national organization called Local Trust, which was set up for this purpose.

Local Trust send a representative to Fratton Big Local Partnership meetings.

# Who runs Fratton Big Local?

Decisions are made by the Fratton Big Local Partnership, which is made up of voting members and non-voting members. Voting members 51% of which have to live, work or play in Fratton.

Non-voting members are people who have skills that could be useful to the Partnership, or work for organizations that provide services to Fratton. Two non-voting places are reserved for a local City Councillor and someone who works for the City Council. There have to be between 8 and 12 voting members, so up to 7 need to live work or play in Fratton.

# How can I get involved?

**Volunteering -** We're always looking for volunteers to help our projects reach as many people as possible. It makes FBL's work more effective and can be an opportunity to meet new people or gain new skills. Over 100 volunteered with FBL last year.

**Fratton Federation -** Bi-monthly meeting where people who run organizations or provide services in Fratton meet to share information and ideas. Over 80 people from over 70 organization took part last year.

**Fratton Traders Association** – An online group for Traders in Fratton Road to share challenges and ideas. They help to plan events such as the annual Fratton Family Festival and support other events like the Family Festive Fox Trail. It has also been involved in consultation on PCC's Future High Street Bid. The city is

**Friends of Kingston Rec** – Help to ensure that the transformed Kingston Rec continues to be safe and clean. They also organize additional play activities and other events including the Family Festive Fox Trail and help the elves install Santa's post box.

### **Fratton CAN!**

The FBL Partnership wants to continue working closely with the community, volunteers, local businesses and partner organizations to make the most positive impact it can in the remaining 2 years of the project. We are exploring ways we might leave a legacy behind us when the project ends. It's an ongoing conversation, so please get in touch with FBL and give us your views.

# What did we do in 2021?

MAY 2021 **Y** 🎗

In March 2020 Fratton Big Local was just about to print that year's Fratton Delivers, but then the world changed. So in May 2021 we produced a new, bigger publication about 2 years activities.

Looking back on it now we thought that the world would snap back to "normal" whatever that might mean in April '21. This did not happen FBL realized that so much had changed it was important to consult the community again online and face to face where possible at events until October'21.

Other practical things happened FBL bought and installed a new notice board to go on the side of the container in Kingston Rec and awarded funding to Fratton Community centre to run the "Wilder Community Centre project."





### JUNE 2021 **Y**

The month started with National Volunteer week and all the hard working FBL volunteers were offered vouchers for free coffee and cake at the Fox Box. The regular quarterly Fratton Federation continued, moving from Zoom to outdoor meetings in the church yard.

### JULY 2021 1 X

Volunteers and staff continued to collect and deliver library books, prescriptions, walk dogs, and dig gardens and some took part in online training too.

PCC decided they could not safely maintain the play tunnel in Kingston Rec play area and so removed it. Fratton Big Local and the Friends of Kingston Rec asked people what they felt should replace it. The top priority was a piece of inclusive play equipment which everyone could use.

# AUGUST 2021 1 1 X

The weather was warm and it seemed the right time for St Mary's to hold their alternative May Fayre and for FBL with support from the Organ Project to hold a Community Picnic. The Big Weekend in the church yard was FBL first attempt at holding a public event since Covid had started.

It was a weekend of stalls and activity on the Saturday and entertainment with the Pompey Pluckers, Black Hat Theatrical performing and origami craft packs on the Sunday. We were still socially distancing but we were out in the church yard together.

The 3rd Inspiring Fratton Awards were launched at the Big Weekend. To publicise this and the Big Weekend events volunteers had delivered flyers to every household in Fratton.

FBL agreed funding for Y Services to run the "Youthy", a regular Monday youth group at the community centre.





### SEPTEMBER 2021 $\P$

Having run the Big Weekend FBL decided that the community was not yet ready for a crowded street event that often attracts 10,000 people and so for the second year the Fratton Family Festival was cancelled. FBL did however help to fund the Fratton Community Festival Fun Day.

After a year long pilot project FBL was neither able to continue running the Fox Box Cafe it's self nor find someone else to run it. The keys and responsibility for it were therefore returned to PCC.

St Mary's, The Organ Project and FBL agreed to work with Journeys Festival International to be the venue for "Where there is Light" Portsmouth Creates had planned the city wide "We Shine" festival for Nov '20. As a result in 2021 FBL agreed to move the Festival of Light Lantern parade to 19/11/21 to be part of it.

# The 3rd year of The Inspiring Fratton Awards

The Inspiring Fratton Awards were set up in 2019 by **Fratton Big Local** and **Stephen Morgan MP** to celebrate people and their achievement in the Fratton Big Local area.

Each category is open to individuals regardless of their age. The important thing is their action's benefit the Fratton Community.

More than one award may be given in a particular category if judges feel it is appropriate.

So if you know someone from Fratton who is a wonderful dancer, an amazing runner, an inspiring teacher or a great volunteer you can nominate them using this form or online using the QR code.

To nominate someone, you will need to have their permission or their parent or carer if they are under 18 years of age. You may also be contacted about your nomination. The judges will be using what you have written about your nominee to make their decisions so think carefully about what you write.

You can only make one nomination in each category and only nominate once. Duplicate forms will be discounted.

The Awards are decided by a panel and will be based on what is written about any one nominee not necessarily on the number of times the same person or organisation is nominated.

More than one award may be given in a particular category if judges feel it is appropriate.

Individuals and organisation who have not been nominated or received an award in previous years are particularly welcome.

### OCTOBER 2021 🏆 🔏



"Where there is Light" the light installation originally made by Squid Soup and refugees and asylum seekers for Gloucester Cathedral as part of the Journeys International festival. It was installed in St Mary's Church, with some additional sound track created by the local refugees and asylum seeker community.

In a week more than 3,500 people visited it, many of them from Fratton including students from all 5 local schools. Visitors comments included:

"Saw lights whilst walking by and just came in

"Restful, peaceful. Lovely to be welcomed by the church. I could stay all evening."

"It is harmonious and beautiful. It has inspired the children and the descriptions are so powerful."

Lantern making workshops started in mid-October ready for the Lantern Parade and animation workshops with community groups ready to screen in 6 local trader's widows. Another part of We Shine.

### NOVEMBER 2021 T



Consultation showed that the most popular piece of new play equipment for Kingston Rec Play area was an inclusive roundabout. FBL started looking for additional funding for the purchase and installation.

"The Ship of the Gods" light installation made by Heinrich and Palmer was installed inside St Mary's. Other light based pieces where placed outside and the city wide We Shine Festival launch was held in the church.

The Festival of Light Lantern Parade was the largest ever with 500 plus people taking part carrying lanterns they had made in FBL workshops or at home.

At least 5,000 people visited "The Ship of the Gods" over the 3 nights of We Shine.

The 3rd annual Inspiring Fratton Awards (IFA) were presented in St Mary's by Stephen Morgan MP. Even though people were beginning to "stay safe to save Christmas" over 70 people attended including, FBL volunteers to be thanked and have cake.

FBL hope the final funding will be secured for the inclusive Roundabout so that it will be ready for everyone to play on in the summer holidays. The Play tunnel is now in Stamshaw Adventure playground.

FBL will be helping people celebrate the Platinum Jubilee locally and the 6th Fratton Family Festival should happen in September and the Festival of Light in late November / early December.
